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### Latest News

- The House and Senate were in session this week, with the Senate approving a “minibus” appropriations bill that included four of the FY 2020 appropriations bills, including the CJS bill which funds various law enforcement grant programs. The House was preoccupied this week with a vote to formally launch an impeachment investigation into President Trump. Negotiations over the FY 2020 Appropriations bills could be delayed until after the impeachment inquiry is completed.
- **IACP 2019 Chicago** - Everyone on the Brooks Bawden Moore team had a productive (and fun) time in Chicago at the IACP conference. The IACP staff always do an amazing job with the conference. Additionally, we enjoyed seeing everyone at ASCIA and MCCA, where many important conversations were had. - **IACP Leadership in Homeland Security Award** - Last week at the annual IACP meeting in Chicago, DHS I&A, the Texas Department of Public Safety, and the Boston Police Department was jointly awarded the IACP Leadership in Homeland Security Award for their collaboration on a DHS report shared via the Homeland Security Information Network, which ultimately led to an arrest. - **Executive Order on Policing** - Last week, President Trump signed an Executive Order on the Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Justice. The Executive Order would study crime, and establish a commission on policing. The commission would examine a whole host of topics including mental health, recruitment, technology, and policing practices. After a year, the commission is tasked with submitting a report to the Attorney General. You can read more about the EO [here](#).
- **Federal Task Force Body Camera Pilot** - Last week, the Department of Justice announced a pilot program that will allow federally deputized task force officers to use body-worn cameras while serving arrest warrants, or other planned arrest operations, and during the execution of search warrants. Although fentanyl use remain a pressing concern in the United States, a government report that details regional differences in drug overdose deaths shows that in much of the country, methamphetamine is a bigger killer. The Trump administration has unveiled a website aimed at helping millions of Americans with substance abuse issues learn about and locate treatment options. FindTreatment.gov is the latest development in the administration's effort to address the nation's opioid crisis. The White House said it believes the site, which went up Wednesday, will enable the tens of millions of Americans with a variety of substance abuse and mental health issues to better access the care they need. Kellyanne Conway, the counselor to President Donald Trump who is leading the White House response to the drug crisis, said the site is designed to provide "connectivity" between treatment providers and those who need help.

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## Legislation on the Floor This Week

House:

**[H.R. 1865](#) - National Law Enforcement Museum Commemorative Coin Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House on 10/28.

**Summary:** This bill directs the Department of the Treasury to mint and issue up to 50,000 \$5 gold coins, 400,000 \$1 silver coins, and 750,000 half-dollar clad coins that are emblematic of the National Law Enforcement Museum in the District of Columbia and the service and sacrifice of law enforcement officers throughout the history of the United States. All sales of such coins shall include specified surcharges, which shall be distributed to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc., for educational and outreach programs and exhibits.

Senate:

**[S. 134](#) - Combat Online Predators Act**

**Status:** Approved by the Senate on 10/28.

**Summary:** This bill increases the maximum prison term for a stalking offense, if the victim is under 18 years of age.

**[H.R. 3055](#) - FY 2020 Minibus Appropriations Act**

**Status:** Approved by the Senate as amended on 10/31; Approved by the House on 6/25.

**Summary:** This minibus appropriations bill will include four annual appropriations bills for fiscal year 2020. The bill includes funding for Agriculture (S 2522), Commerce-Justice-Science (S 2584), Interior-Environment (S 2580), and Transportation-HUD (S 2520) bills.

**[H.R. 2740](#) - FY 2020 Defense Minibus Appropriations Act**



**Status:** Failed to invoke cloture in the Senate on

**Summary:** This minibuss appropriations bill includes annual FY 2020 funding for Defense, Labor HHS, Foreign Operations, and Energy & Water.

Senate Judiciary Committee - [Full Committee Markup](#) - October 17

### [S. 2132 - Promoting Security and Justice for Victims of Terrorism Act of 2019](#)

**Status:** Approved by the Senate Judiciary Committee on 10/17.

**Summary:** To promote security and provide justice for United States victims of international terrorism.

House Homeland Security Committee - Emergency Preparedness Subcommittee Hearing - October 17

### [Defending the Homeland From Bioterrorism: Are We Prepared?](#)

**Summary:** This hearing examined bioterrorism threats to the U.S. Witnesses testified that the U.S. is not fully equipped to deal and respond to these threats. Additionally, the witnesses stated that the development of new technologies to detect these threats are insufficient. There was general agreement that a replacement for the current BioWatch system is needed, and that portable sampling units can provide faster turnaround times. Additionally, for any program to be successful, Federal, state, and local partners must be at the table working together throughout the entire decision making process.

House Judiciary Committee - Crime Subcommittee Hearing - October 17

### [Oversight Hearing on the Federal Bureau of Prisons and Implementation of the First Step Act](#)

**Summary:** This hearing examined the implementation of the First Step Act. Witnesses testified that the Department of Justice remains committed to its implementation. Associate Attorney General Antoinette Bacon informed the Subcommittee that DOJ is evaluating comments it has received on an initial version of the recidivism reduction tool (released in July 2019), referred to as the Prisoner Assessment Tool Targeting Estimated Risk and Needs (PATTERN). The Department is working to release an updated version of the tool in the near future. Several witnesses expressed concerns with PATTERN, who discussed issues related to a lack of transparency associated with the development of the tool. In addition, other witnesses cited concerns related to the tool's accuracy, including issues related to false positives and racial bias. However, one witness who sits on the independent review committee tasked with evaluating the tool, noted that he anticipates modifications, including changes to remove racial bias.

Senate Judiciary Committee - Full Committee Hearing - October 22

### [Sanctuary Jurisdictions: The Impact on Public Safety and Victims](#)

**Summary:** This hearing examined the impact of sanctuary city policies, and its affect on public safety. Witnesses testified that there needs to be a balance between honoring lawful detainers from ICE, and preserving public trust between local law enforcement and migrant communities. Concerns were raised about instances where authorities released criminal aliens despite an ICE detainer request, and went on to commit another heinous offense. Witnesses stated that they are not asking for local law enforcement officials to become immigration agents, but requests cooperation like they do with any other Federal law enforcement agency. They also stated that sanctuary polices make their communities less safe.

### [H.R. 2932 - Homeland Security for Children Act](#)

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to ensure that the needs of children are considered in homeland security planning, and for other purposes.

### [H.R. 3469 - Covert Testing and Risk Mitigation Improvement Act of 2019](#)

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.



**Summary:** To direct the Transportation Security Administration to carry out covert testing and risk mitigation improvement of aviation security operations, and for other purposes.

**[H.R. 3787](#) - DHS Countering Unmanned Aircraft Systems Coordinator Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish in the Department of Homeland Security an Unmanned Aircraft Systems Coordinator, and for other purposes.

**[H.R. 4237](#) - Advancing Cybersecurity Diagnostics and Mitigation Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to authorize the Secretary of Homeland Security to establish a continuous diagnostics and mitigation program in the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

**[H.R. 4402](#) - Inland Waters Security Review Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To require the Secretary of Homeland Security to conduct an inland waters threat analysis, and for other purposes.

**[H.R. 4713](#) - Department of Homeland Security Office of Civil Rights and Civil Liberties Authorization Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to make certain improvements in the Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

**[H.R. 4727](#) - Department of Homeland Security Mentor Protégé Program Act of 2019**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish a mentor-protégé program, and for other purposes.

**[H.R. 4737](#) - Department of Homeland Security Climate Change Research Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to require the Under Secretary for Science and Technology of the Department of Homeland Security to research and evaluate existing Federal research regarding approaches to mitigate climate change on homeland security to identify areas for further research within the Department, research and develop approaches to mitigate the consequences of climate change on homeland security, and for other purposes.

**[H.R. 4739](#) - Synthetic Opioid Exposure Prevention and Training Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to protect U.S. Customs and Border Protection officers, agents, other personnel, and canines against potential synthetic opioid exposure, and for other purposes.

**[H.R. 4753](#) - Drone Origin Security Enhancement Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To prohibit the Secretary of Homeland Security from operating or procuring foreign-made unmanned aircraft systems, and for other purposes.

**[H.R. 4761](#) - DHS Opioid Detection Resilience Act of 2019**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To ensure U.S. Customs and Border Protection officers, agents, and other personnel have adequate synthetic opioid detection equipment, that the Department of Homeland Security has a process to update synthet-



ic opioid detection capability, and for other purposes.

#### **[H.R. 4782](#) - National Commission on Online Platforms and Homeland Security Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House Homeland Security Committee on 10/23.

**Summary:** To establish a national commission on online platforms and homeland security, and for other purposes.

#### **[Marijuana and America's Health: Questions and Issues for Policy Makers](#)**

**Summary:** This hearing examined public health concerns associated with marijuana. The U.S. Surgeon General testified that the legalization of marijuana in several states is a massive public health experiment. He explained his concerns with state legislatures rushing to legalize marijuana despite the public health concerns of marijuana use by children, pregnant women, and recent mothers. He stated that more research is needed, and that in the meantime we shouldn't be rushing into legalization and we need to do more to promote the dangers of smoking marijuana by children and pregnant women.

#### **[H.R. 3889](#) - ONDCP Technical Corrections Act of 2019**

**Status:** Approved by the House on 10/16.

**Summary:** To amend the Office of National Drug Control Policy Reauthorization Act of 1998 to make technical corrections.

#### **[H.R. 724](#) - PACT Act**

**Status:** Approved by the House on 10/22/19

**Summary:** This bill revises and expands criminal provisions with respect to animal crushing. It retains existing criminal offenses that prohibit knowingly creating or distributing an animal crush video using interstate commerce. The bill also adds a new provision to criminalize an intentional act of animal crushing. A violator is subject to criminal penalties—a fine, a prison term of up to seven years, or both. It provides additional exceptions for conduct, or a video of conduct, including conduct that is (1) medical or scientific research, (2) necessary to protect the life or property of a person, (3) performed as part of euthanizing an animal, or (4) unintentional.

#### **[H.R. 2513](#) - Corporate Transparency Act of 2019**

**Status:** Approved by the House on 10/22/19.

**Summary:** To ensure that persons who form corporations or limited liability companies in the United States disclose the beneficial owners of those corporations or limited liability companies, in order to prevent wrongdoers from exploiting United States corporations and limited liability companies for criminal gain, to assist law enforcement in detecting, preventing, and punishing terrorism, money laundering, and other misconduct involving United States corporations and limited liability companies, and for other purposes.

#### **[H.R. 777](#) – Debbie Smith Reauthorization Act of 2019**

**Status:** Approved by the House on 10/23.

**Summary:** This bill reauthorizes grants that support state and local efforts to process DNA evidence in rape kits. Specifically, it reauthorizes through FY2024 the following: grants under the Debbie Smith DNA Backlog Grant Program; grants to provide DNA training and education for law enforcement personnel, corrections personnel, and court officers; and grants under the Sexual Assault Forensic Exam Program.
